- 1 Pet First Aid Book
- 2 Emergency Contact Numbers ie; Animal Poison Control Center – 1-888-426-4435
- 3 Latex-Free Gloves
- 4 Cotton Swabs (\*Q-Tips)
- 5 Small and Large plastic Syringe (\*No needles)
- 6 BPS Free Water Bottle (filled)
- 7 Blunt Nose Scissors
- 8 Nail Clippers (appropriate for your dog's nails)
- 9 Grooming Clippers
- 10 Expired credit cards (to scrape away stingers)
- 11 Ticked-Off Tick Remover
- 12 CPR Shield
- 13 Tweezers
- 14 Rectal Thermometer (non-mercury, non-glass)
- 15 White Adhesive Roll Tape
- 16 Non-Stick Pads for Burns (6)
- 17 Gauze Squares (10)
- 18 Gauze Rolls (4)
- 19 Flex-Wrap Self-Adhering Elastic Bandage
- 20 Triangular Bandage for slings/splints or bandannas
- 21 Emergency Blanket
- 22 Portable Food and Water Bowl
- 23 Emergency Meal and Water
- 24 Doggie Walk Bags
- 25 Pet's Toys
- 26 Some Emergency Room Cash
- 27 Extra Leashes and or "D" Leash
- 28 Cold Packs
- 29 Emergency ID Tag
- 30 1% Hydrocortisone Cream / Anti-inflammatory
- 31 Tri-Buffered Aspirin Tablets (as prescribed by vet)
- 32 Diphen Tablets/Antihistamine (\*Benadryl)
- 33 Diotame Tablets/Antacid (\*Tums)
- 34 Simethicone (\*Gas-X)
- 35 Antibacterial Soap (\*Dial barsoap)
- 36 Chlorexidine Cleanser (\*Hibiclens)
- 37 Water Based Protectant (\*K-Y Jelly)
- 38 Styptic Powder
- 39 Sterile eye lubricant (available at pharmacies)
- 40 Sterile saline eye wash (available at pharmacies)
- 41 Towel
- 42 Wire cutters, small (to cut off embedded hooks if you take your do fishing)
- 43 Pen light
- 44 Muzzle – A cage muzzle is best, but a soft collapsible one may be more convenient to carry.
- 45 Glucose paste or corn syrup (if your dog is diabetic)
